1. Approval of Financial Statement checks/payments:

**Black History Month Musical Journey Saturday, February 8, 2025:** Jim Feeney, WI Blues Association contact, requests \$350.00 for the musicians. Last year there was also a "tip" bucket in circulation during the event. Bake Sale occurred both upstairs and downstairs.

<u>Library Update by Bethany</u>: (given round of applause as the new head librarian) \$3,000.00 currently collected for <u>Explore Passes</u>. \$500.00 more needed. <u>Election Day News</u>: reminder the library will be used exclusively for voting; no patron activity ie use of computers, checking in/out books. Bake Sale - All in attendance at the meeting agreed to have the election day bake sale, even though it comes so close to the book/bake sale. <u>Children's Book Nook</u>: staff is working on decorating the area. <u>BE Fund</u>: provided games for kids, the computer stations, chairs and couches, specially sized for children. The Board will discuss waivers for computer use at their next meeting.

Adding a Blind Date With A Book Sale: Pat explained with photos. An SM Library staff member or SM Friend chooses a book, wraps it in plain brown paper with a bow, adding a few written hints about the book on the front, ie takes place in England, haunting love story, etc. All wrapped books will be placed in one area with \$1.00 price. May or may not be ready for this upcoming sale.
